A year after completing the A21 prevention program, a young girl received a message through social media about an opportunity to make money. The man asked for compromising pictures and said it was "ok" if she was a minor.

The young girl told her teacher, who helped her close the conversation, save the evidence and report the situation to law enforcement.

Without prevention education, this young girl might not have understood this was exploitation. Thankfully, she was equipped to navigate the situation and spared from victimisation.

That's the power of awareness. Who knows? Your decision to host a Screening could be the difference between a life of freedom or exploitation for someone in your world.

FACTS & STATS

Human Trafficking

The problem of human trafficking is both a local and global crisis.

Through force, fraud, and coercion, people everywhere are being bought and sold against their will-right now, in the 21st century. This crime knows no boundaries — affecting every age, demographic, and region.

STATISTICS

- There are an estimated 49.6 million people enslaved in the world today. 1
- 54% of all victims are women and girls. 2
- Human trafficking generates an estimated **US \$236 billion per year**. ²
- Human trafficking occurs in every region of the world and can happen to anyone.

FACTS & STATS

Online Child Sexual Exploitation

Online child sexual exploitation and human trafficking are deeply interconnected, often overlapping in ways that fuel each other.

Online sexual exploitation covers a range of illicit activities, including the creation, distribution, and possession of child sexual abuse images (CSAM), sextortion, and enticing a child to engage in sexually prohibited activity, among others.

Online child sexual exploitation is one of the most urgent crises of our time, with its severity growing at an alarming rate every day.



1 in 3 Internet users worldwide is under 18 years of age.¹



In 2004, there were 450,000 files of suspected CSAM reported. By 2022, that number jumped to more than **87** million.²



67% of child sexual abuse material (CSAM) survivors said the distribution of their images impacts them differently than the hands-on abuse they suffered because the distribution never ends and the images are permanent.³



78% of reports regarding online enticement for sexually explicit content were **directed towards girls**.³

More children are being exploited today than at any other time in history and it's never been easier for perpetrators to reach and abuse them.

Not long ago, sexual exploitation required physical access—usually taking place in hidden or isolated settings. Today, that's no longer the case. Exploitation can happen while they're in our homes, our classrooms—even surrounded by people who love them—hidden in plain sight.

A child may appear completely safe and free, while in reality, they're trapped in a dangerous cycle of online exploitation and manipulation.

WARNING SIGNS OF ONLINE CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

- Showing up with unexplained gifts or possessions that can't be explained.
- Becoming upset, withdrawn, or anxious after using the internet or texting.
- Experiencing a breakdown in relationships—isolating from peers or family, or withdrawing from usual social circles.
- Changes in physical appearance, such as sudden weight loss or alterations in makeup or clothing choices.
- Shifting temperament—becoming moody, aggressive, or withdrawn.
- Accumulating numerous new phone numbers, texts, or email addresses.
- They exhibit secretive behaviour, especially when asked about their activities.
- Receiving excessive texts or calls.
- Excessive time on mobile phones, gaming consoles, or other electronic devices
- Leaving home without explanation or frequently returning home late.
- Struggling with sleep or eating habits, and showing signs of anxiety.
- Skipping school or becoming disruptive in class.
